

A Prayer for Heroic Leaders

Rich Nathan - Congregational Letter, May 09

Along with eight other Vineyard leaders from across the country, I recently traveled to the Middle East. We spent two weeks interacting with business, governmental, and religious leaders in Lebanon, Jordan, Syria, the West Bank and Israel. We also saw first-hand the horrific living conditions of 25,000 Palestinians who are crowded into a refugee camp outside Beirut and the oppression felt on the West Bank as soldiers, guard towers, walls and checkpoints keep people from being able to visit family members or obtain work.

I also met a very significant Muslim leader, who is a Holocaust denier. Can you imagine anyone, who is a global religious leader, denying the historical reality of the Holocaust a mere 60 years after the event? But there he was – arguing that the Holocaust was a Jewish fabrication.

During the weeks we were in the Middle East and in the time since, I have repeatedly asked God to raise up a heroic leader who will lead the warring factions towards a just and lasting peace. Lord, where is the Palestinian Dr. King or Nelson Mandela? God, where is the Israeli Lincoln? Where are the heroes in the Middle East?

What, in my mind, does a heroic leader look like? Here are three marks:

1. A heroic leader transcends the culture and national perspectives in which he or she was raised. In other words, heroic leaders are those who walk in the shoes of their adversaries and asks the questions: “What does it feel like to be you?” “Why do you see the world as you do?”

I met a heroic leader named Sami, who is a Palestinian Arab Christian. His grandfather, who was a devoted Christian leader, was shot to death by an Israeli sniper during the 1948 War of Independence. Sami chose to spend ten days in a barracks at the Auschwitz Concentration Camp because he wanted to feel, in the core of his being, how the experience of

the Holocaust impacts current Israeli perspectives. Imagine being willing to not only feel one's own pain, but to be willing to feel the pain of the people who killed a family member and who make your own life miserable. That's heroic!

2. A heroic leader is willing to pay the price of being different. There is a huge price to be paid when we tell people a story other than the one they have heard all their lives. People know and believe the story of violence and retaliation. Advocating nonviolence and reconciliation based upon truth is costly. Dr. King, Gandhi, and Yitzhak Rabin were all murdered because most people prefer the way of violence.

Whenever a leader alters the normal telling of a story, there is a price to be paid. John Wimber, the founder of the Vineyard movement, was called a “heretic” and a “charismatian” for telling the evangelical world that the Holy Spirit was still part of the Trinity and that the Spirit wanted to show up at church. Today, when Christians point out that the Bible speaks more often about the poor and our obligation to “do justice” than almost anything else, they are called Marxists, socialists and liberals.

3. Heroic leaders follow the example of the supreme hero, Jesus Christ. God gave us the model hero who set the pattern for all subsequent heroic leaders, Jesus the Messiah. According to Christ's pattern, heroes don't return evil for evil; heroes forgive their enemies; heroes pray; heroes serve; heroes love people who the religious community rejects; heroes transcend their own culture and narrow national interests; heroes bring good news to the poor; heroes speak the truth fearlessly; heroes have integrity. I could multiply this list fifty-fold as I describe my hero, Jesus.

But I would close with two requests: Pray for God to raise up heroic leaders, especially in the Middle East. And seek, in your own life, to follow the pattern of history's greatest hero, Jesus the Messiah.

how a christian G.R.O.W.S.

giving relationships outreach worship spiritual empowerment

G.R.O.W.S. is an acronym to illustrate our discipleship courses, events and behavior that will essentially help us “grow” in your relationship with Jesus Christ. As a disciple of Christ, we want to continually grow in our faith while avoiding complacency.

These five characteristics represent areas of your life in which you will mature the longer you follow Jesus:

Giving - God desires His people to give generously of their service, money, time, talents and possessions. We give because He first gave His Son Jesus to us.

Relationships - God desires His followers to live in loving, healthy relationships with others. This involves being part of a Christian community that promotes healing and connecting with others as they grow in Christ.

Outreach - God desires every person on Earth to trust His Son, Jesus, and enter into a personal relationship with Him. As Jesus’ followers, we participate in His mission to the world, reaching out to the least, lost, last and the lonely of our world; by sharing and demonstrating the Good News of God’s Kingdom.

Worship (and Prayer) - God desires His followers to worship Him and to seek Him in prayer. Worship and prayer are our response of love to God, both in a public and private setting, based upon who He is, what He has said, and what He has done.

Spiritual Empowerment - God desires our lives to be filled with His Spirit so that we minister in the power of the Spirit, exercise all the biblical gifts of the Spirit, and express the fruit of the Spirit.

You may be stronger in some areas than others, but a true disciple is to exhibit all these characteristics. At Vineyard Columbus, we have organized many of our classes and training sessions around this acronym to guide you in your growth as a disciple. To help you assess what area(s) of spiritual growth in which you may need further assistance, we have developed a Spiritual Assessment & Growth Plan. You can locate this tool in the G.R.O.W.S. EVERYONE GETS THE EMPOWERED

My two-year-old son, Kian, enthusiastically prays for healing for anyone with the slightest manifestation of illness or injury. His prayers are completely natural and sound exactly the same as if he were asking for a drink of water or a snack. One night he prayed over our dinner, "Come Lord Jesus, heal this chicken." As amusing as it was, I am overjoyed that he is learning to interact with the Holy Spirit in a way that isn't "spooky" or "over-spiritualized." He is learning one of the foundations of our faith; that everyone, regardless of age, experience, education, etc., is welcome and encouraged to engage in the ministry of the Holy Spirit. As John Wimber termed it, we are "naturally supernatural." In other words, the ministry of the Holy Spirit is powerful, but we interact with Him in a way that is natural and comfortable.

The Empowered Life Ministry at Vineyard Columbus, led by Executive Pastor Craig Heselton and Pastoral Coordinator Sue Burkett, encompasses all of the events, classes and workshops focused on growing our knowledge and experience of the Holy Spirit. The ministry of the Holy Spirit, however, is foundational to all of the ministries of the church. The Empowered Life Ministry seeks to equip the congregation in areas like Healing, Spiritual Gifts, Hearing God's Voice and much more. There is Open Prayer for Healing the second and fourth Saturdays of the month, and Holy Spirit Empowerment Night the second Friday of every month. In essence, the Holy Spirit is working in our church!

One of the ways the Holy Spirit works is through physical healing. Olga O'Neil began feeling ill the summer of 2008. Upon visiting her doctor, she was informed she had an ovarian cyst that was possibly malignant. The doctor continued to observe her in the months to come and finally suggested surgery as he became increasingly concerned about the tumor. Olga began receiving prayer regularly from a Soaking Prayer Team, as well as from her home group. In February she saw her doctor at an appointment prior to her scheduled surgery and as he

explained the process to her, she requested he check the cyst one last time. To his shock, he found her tumor had shrunk since the last time he checked it! He cancelled her surgery due to her progress. She told him she had been receiving regular prayer for healing, to which he responded "Praise God!" Olga was ecstatic at the news and continues to get regular prayer for the cyst to be completely healed.

Another way the Holy Spirit ministers to us is through emotional healing. Jane Flewellen, a mother of three, was in VLI when her youngest son (22 at the time) died by suicide. He suffered from bipolar disorder. After experiencing a period of psychotic mania, he entered a state of deep depression. When he ended his life, Jane was in intense emotional pain. However, she was shown grace, love and compassion in many different ways by the church. One of the ways she found emotional healing was through Soaking Prayer. She received prayer twice a month for nine months and commented on how, during her prayer sessions, people spoke relatively few words. The Holy Spirit simply came and sat with her and mended her broken heart. She now leads a Soaking Prayer Team and seeks to minister to other people in the same way she received during her time of need.

It doesn't matter how much (or how little) experience you have relating with the Holy Spirit; there is a place for you to begin. A good place to start is the Holy Spirit Retreat, the Healing 1 class or a Holy Spirit Empowerment Night. A great place to practice listening to God's voice and praying for others is at your home group. You can even sign up to have someone come to your group and teach on listening to God's voice! We see the Holy Spirit move in so many different ways, from drastic physical healings to quiet words of encouragement. His ministry underlies everything we do at Vineyard Columbus. How natural it is then, for us to learn more about how to hear His voice, how to pray for others, and to press out in obedience when He speaks to us. My two-year-old son interacts with the Holy Spirit in a way that challenges me to seek God more often for the small things as well as the large. It's a reminder that the Holy Spirit works through all of his children, not just the ones who are pastors or leaders. The Holy Spirit resides in everyone who is a follower of Jesus. I encourage you to take a class or come out for an Empowerment Night. Who knows how God will move that day, but one thing is certain: when God shows up, lives are changed.

Our Small Group meets regularly on Wednesday nights. We just had our largest attendance yet, with 26 adults packed into a living room built for 10! We are teaching regularly about the vision behind the church plant in Amsterdam, and by God's grace, there is a lot of momentum towards sharing the love of God with this city.


